

March-Tips and Tasks

Top Priorities

- Soil Preparation
 - Begin preparing your soil by adding compost or wellrotted manure. This sets the foundation for healthy plant growth.
- Pruning
 - Trim away dead or damaged branches from shrubs and trees. This encourages new growth as spring approaches.
 - Prune Ornamental Grasses/Herbaceous Perennials
 - English roses should be cut back to 4-5 stems. Other roses should be pruned according to their type
- Early Planting
 - Start planting cool-season crops like lettuce, spinach, and peas. Check local frost dates to avoid unexpected cold spells.
 - Plant indoor seeds for annuals and vegetables.



Next Steps

- Weed Control
 - Tackle weeds early to prevent them from competing with emerging plants. Mulch can help suppress weed growth.
- Fertilizing
 - Add plant nutrition by fertilizing ornamental grasses when they show signs of growth, as well as Clematis, Camellias and summer flowering bulbs.
- Dividing Perennials
 - Divide overcrowded perennials for healthier plants.
 Replant or share divided segments with other gardeners.
- Mulching
 - Apply a layer of mulch around established plants to retain soil moisture and regulate temperature







 Sharpen garden tools and ensure they are in good condition for the upcoming growing season.



Plan for Pollinators

 Choose plants that attract pollinators like bees and butterflies. Consider adding a pollinator-friendly section to your garden.

Early Blooms

 Introduce early-blooming flowers like crocuses and daffodils for a burst of color. These also provide essential nectar for pollinators.
